ABOUT THE SOCIETY

Founded in 1987, the St. Thomas More Society, Sacramento (STMS) is an independent board-governed organization, sponsored by Catholic lawyers, with its membership open to attorneys and other legal professionals and legislative advocates of any religious persuasion who subscribe to its purposes.

The purposes of STMS are to serve as a mutual support group, to foster individual spiritual growth, to further interfaith understanding, to promote the teachings of the Second Vatican Council, and to advocate, encourage, and model respect, civility, and ethics in the practice of law.

STMS does not engage in advocacy or take stands on controversial political questions; nor does it engage in fundraising.

The official first meeting of the current "St. Thomas More Society of Sacramento County" took place on May 10, 1988, in the basement of the Cathedral, after Bishop Francis A. Quinn galvanized a group to put together a local Red Mass -- a tradition (from the 13th century) of requesting that the Holy Spirit bless public officials and members of the legal community with guidance and understanding in their work.

STMS became an affiliate of the Sacramento County Bar Association (SCBA) in 2005 and has been a frequent sponsor of SCBA events, including the Bench Bar Reception.

STMS has, since 2006, co-sponsored an annual Ethics luncheon with the J. Reuben Clark Law Society (JRCLS) and the Brigham Young University Management Society (BYUMS).

Some who come in contact with the court system may suffer from various mental illnesses. Recognizing any impediments those individuals have or assistance they may need, while recognizing any biases we may bring to the table, enables us to both respect the individual and promote the administration of justice.

Using examples from Sacramento's diversion courts, Judge Lawrence Brown (Sacramento County Bar Association's 2022 *Judge of the Year*) will describe some methods for bringing justice to those suffering from mental illness in the Sacramento area.

STATE BAR IMPOSES NEW IMPLICIT BIAS CE REQUIREMENT

In January 2019, the Board of Trustees updated the State Bar's 2017–2022 Strategic Plan to include an objective focused on modifying the current elimination of bias MCLE curriculum and increasing the number of hours.

Concurrently, the California State Legislature advanced AB 242, adding Business and Professions Code section 6070.5 to require the State Bar to enact rules incorporating the topic of implicit bias and biasreducing strategies into its MCLE curriculum for all attorneys.

Subsequently, rule 2.72 of the Rules of the State Bar of California, related to attorney MCLE requirements, was amended effective September 24, 2020, to incorporate this new implicit bias education requirement. As such, on and after January 1, 2022, while all attorneys will still be required to complete 25 hours of MCLE every three years, the total hours must now include no less than seven hours as follows:

- At least four hours of legal ethics.
- At least two hours dealing with elimination of bias. Of the two hours, at least one hour must focus on implicit bias and the promotion of bias reducing strategies.
- At least one hour of education addressing competence issues.

Specifically, this new implicit bias education requirement will begin applying to attorneys in MCLE compliance group 3 who must report compliance for the period ending on January 31, 2023.

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

Q: Is STMS membership open to non-Catholics?A: Yes. One of our mission principles is to be open to all persons who subscribe to the purposes of STMS.

Q: Is this group just for attorneys?

A: No. Our membership is open to the legal profession, broadly defined: attorneys, paralegals, law office secretaries and administrators, judges and clerks, lobbyists, legislative advocates, government workers, students, retired legal professionals, and all who subscribe to the purposes of STMS.

THOMAS WHO?

Sir Thomas More was an English lawyer, writer,

and statesman. He was at one time one of Henry VIII's most trusted civil servants, becoming Chancellor of England in 1529. However, More was also a passionate defender of Catholic orthodoxy, and was ultimately executed by beheading on July 6, 1535. In 2000, Pope John



Paul II declared St. Thomas More "the heavenly Patron of Statesmen and Politicians." Although Pope Pius XI canonized Thomas More and John Fisher on 19 May 1935, and More's feast day was established as **July 9th**, the General Roman Calendar celebrates More with Fisher on **June 22** (the date of Fisher's execution).
